We're about to head into a week that will be the "hardest and the saddest" for most living Americans, the U.S. surgeon general said Sunday morning. "This is going to be our Pearl Harbor moment, our 9/11 moment, only it's not going to be localized, it's going to be happening all over the country and I want America to understand that", Vice Admiral Jerome Adams said. Officials say the next two weeks will be crucial in the fight to stop the spread of the coronavirus. "I want Americans to understand that as hard as this week is going to be, there is a light at the end of the tunnel," Adams said.

Here's what else you need to know about COVID-19 around the U.S.:

- The nation's top infectious disease expert said Sunday that the United States is "struggling" to get the coronavirus crisis under control.
- Ford is making a face shield every 10 seconds, a spokesperson said.
- New York's governor said the state may be seeing a slight plateau in cases, but cautioned about assuming this a trend.
- There are more than 324,000 cases in the United States. More than 9,100 people have died nationwide.
